The U.S. has a record maternal and fetal health crisis — with Black communities experiencing disproportionately high rates of maternal and infant mortality.¹ With 84% of maternal deaths deemed fully preventable,² it's clear more can — and must — be done to advance this area of care delivery for historically marginalized groups.

Recognizing minority participation in clinical trials hovers under 5%,³ Acclinate leverages its NOWINCLUDED community platform and e-DICT platforms to reach BIPOC communities with relevant content, resources, and experiences for maternal and fetal health.

Our Initial Results

Notable Findings

Standout results from respondents answering about how they seek out pregnancy- and childbirth-related information.

46% of respondents reported using pregnancy apps

75% rely on OBGYNs as primary source of information and guidance

41% cited using Google as a go-to source

41% reported turning to family and friends

51% would only travel within 10 miles for maternal care
